Baptism - Who, What, and Why Infant Baptism?

Ezekiel 18:20, Ecclesiastes 7:29 infants don't have sin and therefore don't need to be baptized

Colossians 3:17 there is no authority for infant baptism

Matthew 28:19, Mark 16:15-16 teaching/preaching must come before baptism

Mark 16:16, Acts 2:38 belief and repentance must come before baptism

Acts 2:41-42 those baptized received the word first and then continued in the apostles' doctrine and prayers afterwards

Acts 8:12 they (the "multitudes" - verse 6 NKJV) were baptized, both men and women

Acts 8:35-37 **if thou believest with all thine heart**, thou mayest

Acts 22:16 baptism is calling on (asking) God for salvation (which an infant cannot do)

I Peter 3:21 baptism is an appeal (which an infant cannot do)

infant baptism, why is the issue important? Matthew 15:9, II John verse 9

Sprinkling For Baptism?

The Greek word translated "baptism" is Strong's #908 and means:

- Thayer immersion, submersion
- Vine immersion, submersion, and emergence ... to dip
- Wigram-Green to immerse

Romans 6:4 "buried with him by baptism." When somebody dies and we "bury" them in the graveyard, does that mean we stand them up and sprinkle a little dirt on their head, or does that mean we put them all the way under the ground? - I think we know what "buried" means then.

Romans 6:5 "For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection." So water baptism is a likeness of the burial and resurrection of Jesus. Sprinkling for baptism is not a likeness of that, is it? But immersion is.

Colossians 2:12 "Buried with him in baptism, wherein also ye are risen with him" Consider the same point as made from Romans 6:4-5

Acts 8:38-39 "And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both **into the water**, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. And when they were come up **out of the water**" Why go down into the water if only to sprinkle?

John 3:23 "And John also was baptizing in Aenon near to Salim, because there was **much water** there." You certainly don't need much water at all just to sprinkle, do you?

Baptism Because Already Saved?

Mark 16:16 He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved ...

John 3:5 ... except a man be born of water ... he cannot enter into the kingdom

Acts 22:16 ... arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins ...

Romans 6:3 ... baptized into his death ...

Galatians 3:26-27 ... baptized into Christ ...

Col 2:11-13 putting off ... the sins of the flesh ... buried . in baptism . having forgiven you all trespasses

I Peter 3:20-21 ... baptism doth also now save us ...

Acts 2:38 ... be baptized ... for the remission of sins ... (what if you think you already had the remission of sins?)
