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"FEAR YE NOT ME?"

Let us know every waking moment that God beholds. There is no person, nor deed, but what is manifest in His sight. And judgment! How true the words of Jefferson: "I fear for my countrymen when I remember that God is just." As He Himself hath arrestingly said: "Fear ye not me?"

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Editorial . . . "PROOF REQUESTED, PROOF GIVEN" (No. 17)

Our investigation last month proved by the Scriptures that the teaching that "There is nothing in a name" is false doctrine. The fact that multitudes of people assert such teaching over and over does not prove it to be in harmony with God's truth.

We hereby challenge those who advocate that there is nothing in a name to prove by the Scriptures that such is the case. The fact that hundreds of men who have preached for "fifty years" believe and teach that "there is nothing in a name" does not mean that such a doctrine is true. The Scriptures are the standard by which such teaching is to be "weighed", "measured", or examined.

Number fourteen is the next item to be examined in the list of twenty-five things that appeared in THE IN-STRUCTOR, October, 1983, under "Specific Wickedness" for which Scriptural proof for the opposite view (than that stated in #14) has been requested. It reads as follows:

"14. Alien sinners may pray through to salvation."

COMMENTS: The idea that alien sinners (those who are accountable to God who are not His children and thus are lost in sin) may be saved by prayer is a prevalent one. Many preachers believe and preach that "alien sinners should find an old-fashioned altar somewhere and pray through to salvation." A number of television and radio

preachers will encourage sinners to repeat after them a prayer that goes something like this: "God, I confess unto thee my sins. I accept Jesus Christ into my heart as my personal Saviour." or something along this line. It is a common practice among many denominational churches to invite and urge sinners to "come to the altar and pray for salvation." It seems that "multitudes" accept without question this teaching. However "appealing" and "attractive" this doctrine may be, when it is candidly examined in the light of God's Word, it will be found to be a false doctrine!

A consideration of the following facts and principles should enlighten any seeker of truth that such teaching is without Scriptural basis.

1. Prayer is man speaking to God. It is the thoughts and desires of the heart expressed. Prayer may consist of praise, thanks, confession, petition and intercession. Prayer may be either private or public.

2. Under the Old Testament law, Solomon said: "He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination." (Proverbs 28:9). NOTE: In order for God to hear the prayer of those under the law, it was essential that they listen to the law! If they would not listen to God's law, their prayers were an abomination!

3. We learn from Isaiah 59:1-2 that iniquities separated between God and His people, and their sins hid God's face from them that God would not hear! God's ear was not heavy that it could not hear, but it would not hear! Neither would the Lord's hand save!

4. David, a man after God's own heart, said: "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will NOT hear me." (Psalms 66:18). QUESTION: What makes one think that God will save alien sinners because they pray in view of the fact that the Lord would not hear David when he prayed if he regarded iniquity in his heart?

5. The blind man, whose eyes Jesus opened, said: "Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth His will, him He heareth." (John 9:31). COMMENTS: Some try to

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discredit this statement by stating that this man was **not** an **inspired** man. The fact that this man was an **uninspired** does **not** necessarily mean that he did not state the truth. In fact, his statement **is** in harmony with all the **inspired** information that we have on the subject.

6. God's people, the Jews, had gone so far into sin at the time under consideration in Jeremiah 11:14 that God said: "Therefore pray not thou for this people, neither lift up a cry or prayer for them: for I WILL NOT HEAR THEM in the time that they cry unto me for their trouble."

7. The apostle Peter says: "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and HIS EARS ARE OPEN UNTO THEIR PRAYERS: But the face of the Lord is against them that do evil." (1 Peter 3:12). NOTE: This verse specifically says the ears of the Lord are open unto the prayers of the righteous! His face is against evil doers! Alien sinners are evil doers. These facts are in harmony with the statement in John 9:31.

8. The apostle John said: "And whatsoever we ask we receive of him, BECAUSE WE KEEP HIS COMMANDMENTS, and DO THOSE THINGS THAT ARE PLEASING IN HIS SIGHT." (1 John 3:22). NOTE: Alien sinners do not keep God's commandments and do not do those things that are pleasing in His sight!

9. Alien sinners are servants of sin and are thus children of the devil. (See John 8:34; 1 John 3:8-10; John 8:44). They are of their father the devil. As children of the devil, they have no assurance that when they address God as their father that He will hear them.

10. Jesus taught His disciples to **pray** after this manner, saying, "Our **Father**, which art in heaven,..." (See Luke 11:1-4). NOTE: If one is **not** a child of God, **his** father is **not** in heaven.

OBSERVATIONS:

- 1. There is **no command** in the Scriptures for alien sinners to pray for salvation.
 - 2. There is no example in the New

Testament where any alien sinner ever was saved by praying through!

3. There is no necessary implication in the New Testament that an alien sinner may pray through to salvation.

4. When Jesus gave the great commission He told the apostles to "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. HE THAT BELIEVETH AND IS BAPTIZED SHALL BE SAVED: but he that believeth not shall be damned." (Mark 16:15-16). NOTE: Prayer cannot be substituted for belief and baptism! The King has spoken!

5. In Acts 2:37-38 when the Jews heard the preaching and were pricked in their hearts and asked the apostles. "What shall we do?", the apostle Peter said; "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ FOR THE REMISSION OF SINS, ..." NOTE: In Acts 2:21 Peter had already told these people that "whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' Peter now tells them what they must do in order to "call on the name of the Lord" in order to be saved. FURTHER NOTE: Prayer cannot be substituted for repentance and baptism!

6. In reply to the question, "what must I do to be saved?", the jailor was told to "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." Paul and Silas then spake unto him (and those in his house) the word of the Lord. On hearing the Lord's word, the jailor was baptized the same hour of the night. He then "rejoiced, believing in God with all his house." (See Acts 16:31-34). NOTE: The jailor was not told to "say the sinner's prayer" or to "get on your knees and pray through to salvation" He was told to BELIEVE. He was taught the word of the Lord that produces faith and he was baptized!

7. When Saul of Tarsus said: "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?", the Lord told him to "Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do." (See Acts 9:6). Although Saul was a praying, fasting, penitent believer, three days after he conversed with the Lord, in Damascus, he was told to "... Arise,

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and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord." (See Acts 9, 22 & 26). NOTE: His praying had not removed his sins!

8. A penitent believer is "baptized INTO Christ." (See Gal. 3:26-27 & Romans 6:1-5). NOTE: There is no evidence that prayer puts one "into Christ."

CONCLUSIONS:

1. The fact that an alien sinner prays will not save him from sin. NOTE: Cornelius "prayed to God alway" but he was lost. His "prayers" and "alms" went up for a memorial before God. His "prayer" was "heard" in some sense but it did not save him. He had to hear "words", believe and be baptized in order to be saved. (See Acts 10:34-48 & 11:14-18).

2. Prayer is not a condition that an alien sinner must meet in order to be saved from his past sins. NOTE: If it is, then someone should show the Scripture or Scriptures that teach it.

3. In order to be saved, alien sinners must believe that God is and is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him and that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, repent, confess faith in Christ and be baptized in water! (See Hebrews 11:6; John 20:30-31; Mark 16:15-16; Romans 10:9-10; Acts 2:38; Gal. 3:26-27). NOTE: Prayer cannot be substituted for faith and obedience to God's will! Please also read Matthew 7:21-23 very carefully.

When a person presumes to speak the doctrine that "alien sinners may pray through to salvation" in the name of Christ, he is speaking presumptuously and is teaching false doctrine because such is not taught in God's word! The person who so speaks is guilty of wickedness! We should so "speak" and so "do" as those who will be judged "by the law of liberty." (See James 1:25).

Let us remember that the Lord said: "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word which I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day."
