CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED!

There are various "callings" in life. They come from various sources and may involve secular or physical things. However, in this study we are concerned about the "calling of God." GOD calls us! (Cf. Acts 2:36-39). Our study will center around this calling.

I. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED WITH A HIGH CALLING! (Read Phil. 3:13-14). This calling is from "up" or "above!" It comes from One in a "high" or "great place." It comes from One who is "high" and "great." (See Heb. 10:21; Psa. 113:5; Heb. 4:14-15 & Gen. 14:18).

II. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED WITH AN HOLY CALLING! (Read 2 Tim. 1:9). This calling comes from One who is holy and its enjoins upon us the responsibility to be holy! (See John 17:1 & 1 Peter 1:13-16).

III. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED WITH A HEAVENLY CALLING! (Read Heb. 3:1). This calling is from heaven to us to come to heaven! We should "seek those things which are above!" We should set our affection "on

things above!" (See Col. 3:1-2).

IV. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED OUT OF DARKNESS INTO LIGHT! (Read 1 Peter 2:9). Paul declared: "... We are not of the night, nor of the darkness." (1 Thess. 5:5). We are "the children of light!" We are "the light of the world!" We should "walk in the light" and let our light shine! (See 1 John 1:7 & Mt. 5:14-16).

V. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED TO BE SAINTS! (Read 1 Cor. 1:2. Saints have an inheritance! (See Col. 1:12 & 1 Peter 1:4). NOTE: A saint is "one set apart to be, as it were, exclusively God's." We should act like saints!

VI. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED WITH A VOCATION (WAY OF LIFE)! (Read Eph. 4:1-3) We have a new way of life! We think, talk, dress and act differently! We allow Jesus Christ to be Lord in our lives!

VII. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED UNTO (INTO) THE FELLOWSHIP OF CHRIST! (Read 1 Cor. 1:9). This calling (Continued on page 4)

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Editorial . . .

WHY DO YOU BELIEVE...?

(No. 2)

In studying the question, "Why do you believe what you do?," we should keep in mind that what we believe and why we believe it are both important. We should "be ready always to give an answer" to those who ask concerning our hope. We should be prepared and willing to give an answer. In our previous study we asked: Do you believe what you do because the majority believes it? Let us continue our study.

II. DO YOU BELIEVE WHAT YOU DO BECAUSE OF YOUR FEELINGS? There are many people who allow their emotions to be the standard by which they determine what they believe. If they "feel" that a certain thing is right they accept it. If not, they reject it. Some will say. "I know I am saved because I feel like I am," or "I wouldn't trade what I feel for a stack of Bibles a mile high," or "I just feel like it is right," etc.

Jacob "morned for his son (Joseph) many days" and "refused to be comforted" and said "I will go down into the grave of my son mourning" because he really "felt like" his son Joseph was dead! However, twenty or so years later Jacob found his son Joseph alive in Egypt! His "belief" that Joseph was dead caused him to "feel" sorrowful.

(Cf. Gen. 37:23-35).

Our "feelings" are not the standard by which we must live and by which we will be judged in the last day! Jeremiah 17:9 says: "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?" Solomon warned: "He that trusteth in his own heart is is a fool: ..." (Proverbs 28:26). Hear Solomon again: "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death." (Proverbs 16:25). A way is not right merely because "it seems right!"

No doubt, Saul of Tarsus "felt like" he was serving God when he beat and imprisoned Christians and when he "consented" to the death of Stephen and "kept the raiment of them that slew him." (See Acts 22:19-20). Later he declared: "I verily thought with myself, that I ought to do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth. Which thing I also did in Jerusalem: ..." (Acts 26:9-10).

One cannot know that he is saved because he "feels" like he is! However, one can know that he is "saved" by what is written in God's Word. John said: "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may KNOW that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God."(1 John 5:13). We can know by what is written that we have eternal life! No, we cannot know by our "feelings!"

Teeming millions of people believe and practice false doctrines because they "feel like" they are right! What about you? Do you believe what you do because of your feelings? You cannot trust your "feelings" to be a proper standard as to what is right. You must allow the Word of God to be your standard! If you would please God, you must believe

what you do **because** it is what **God's Book teaches!** Do you?

III. DO YOU BELIEVE WHAT YOU DO BECAUSE OF TRADITIONS? Some people believe what they do because they have been taught human traditions. They have been taught doctrines and commandments of men. They do not question what they have been taught, but blindly accept it. In speaking to the scribes and Pharisees, Jesus said: "Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying This people draweth night unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me. But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." (Mt. 15:7-9). Jesus also said: "For laying aside the commandment of God, ye hold the tradition of men, as the washing of pots and cups: and many other such things ye do." (Mark 7:8). He also said: "Full well ye reject the commandment of God, that ye may keep your own tradition." (Verse 9). Traditions of men make void the Word of God!

Prior to his becoming a disciple of Christ, Saul was "zealous of the traditions" of his fathers. During that time he "persecuted the church of God, and wasted it." (See Gal. 1:13-14). Later he exhorted: "Not giving heed to Jewish fables and commandments of men, that turn from the truth." (Titus 1:14). In Col. 2:8 Paul warned: "Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy after and vain deceit. traditions of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ." (Col. 2:8).

Peter mentions the fact that those to whom he addressed his first epistle had received their prior vain conversation by tradition from their fathers. (Cf. 1 Pet. 1:18).

The following is a list of some of the

teachings which originaed by the wisdom of men and have been passed on to others. These things are often accepted without question because they are "traditionally" handed down.

- 1. "Salvation is by faith ONLY!"
- 2. There is nothing in a name."
- 3. "One can be saved by praying through."
- 4. "It does not matter how one worships God as long as he is sincere!"
 - 5. "Sprinkling is baptism!"
 - 6. "Once saved, always saved!"
- 7. "One church is just as good as another!"
- 8. "Baptism is not essential to salvation!"
- 9. "A church cannot withhold or withdraw fellowship from another church!"
- 10. "Churches may Scripturally donate funds out of their treasuries to human institutions such as Childhaven, Inc., David Lipscomb College, etc.
- 11. "We are not under any system of law!"
- 12. "A church cannot withhold or withdraw fellowship from a person who is not a member of that local church!"

Many people will "swallow" the above teachings "hook, line and sinker" although **none** of the above things are taught in the Scriptures!

Some churches use mechanical instruments of music in worship, celebrate Christmas and Easter and have church pageants, etc. because of traditions.

Paul warned: "Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after rudiments of the world, and not after Christ." (Col. 2:8).

Do you believe what you do because of your "feelings?" Traditions of men? You should not!

VIII. CHRISTIANS ARE CALLED UNTO HOPE! (Read Eph. 4:4). Also see Rom 15:4; 8:24; 5:2-5; 6:19; 12:12; 7:19; Tit. 1:2; 2:7 & 1 John 3:3.

We did **not** receive a mysterious, direct, miraculous calling! We were **called by the gospel!** It is available to all! (Read 2 Thess. 2:14; Rom. 1:16; Mk. 16:15-16; 2 Thess. 1:7-9). When God calls, we must answer! We can say **yes** (accept) or **no** (reject)! (CRS)
