CHRISTIANS ARE BUILDERS (No.3)

As we continue our consideration of CHRISTIANS ARE BUILDERS let us keep in mind that each of us are responsible to God and He will hold us accountable for **what** we build and **how** we build. Not only should we build **good names** and **good solid families**, but we should also build:

3. GOOD INFLUENCES! Each of us will influence others - either for good or bad! As John said, "...the whole world lieth in wickedness." (1 John 5:19). Wicked people exert wicked or evil influences! Godly people exert good or godly influences!

God expects Christians to think, speak and act in such a way as to exert a good or godly influence upon others. In addressing disciples Jesus said: "Ye are the salt of the earth:..." (Matthew 5:13). Salt has preserving power. The world needs "preserving." Christians, like salt, should have a "preserving" power. Salt has a seasoning quality. The world needs "seasoning." Christians, like salt, should have a "seasoning" influence upon the world.

Jesus also said to His disciples: "Ye are the light of the world...Let your light so shine be

fore men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16). People in the world are in darkness! They need light! Jesus Christ is the LIGHT of the world! (Cf. John 8:12). Christians are to reflect Christ through their attitudes, words and actions. They are to "shine as lights in the world; Holding forth the word of life." (Phil. 2:14-16). In writing to the saints at Ephesus, the apostle "For said: уe sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light." NOTE: Since we are now Christians we should "walk as children of light." (Eph. 5:8). People of the world will be influenced more by our teaching if our lives reflect the light of Christ!

Timothy was admonished by Paul: "...Be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity." (1 Tim. 4:12). All Christians, like Timothy, should be good examples! We should be examples of believers!

Young men are to be exhorted "to be sober minded." (Titus 2:6). All of us should endeavor to be "a pattern of good works."

Editorial ... BAPTISM PROPER SUBJECTS

Many people who understand the action and the purpose (or design) of baptism do not understand who are the proper subjects of baptism. In this study we are to see who are the proper subjects of baptism.

First, let us consider the question (who are the proper subjects of baptism?) from a negative view point. The following are NOT proper subjects of baptism.

1. INFANTS! When we consider the Scriptures that show the purpose of baptism, we can readily see that infants do NOT qualify as subjects of Scriptural baptism! Scriptures show that baptism must be preceded by teaching (Mt. 28:19), faith (Mk. 16:15-16; Heb. 11:6), repentance (Acts 2:36-41), and **confession** (Acts 36-37; Rom. 10:9-10) but infant baptism requires NONE of these. Therefore infants are NOT proper subjects baptism!

2. BORN AGAIN PEOPLE! To be born again it is essential that a person "be born of water and of the Spirit" which involves water baptism. (See John 3:1-5) However, baptism has NO benefit to a person after he has been "born again!"

3. GOD'S CHILDREN! A person becomes a child of God by faith WHEN he is baptized into Christ! (Read Gal. 3:26-27). NOTE: There is no proof in God's Word that baptism is for children of God!

4. SAVED PEOPLE! Since Jesus said: "He that believeth and IS BAPTIZED SHALL BE SAVED..." (Mk. 16:16), it is obvious that baptism come before salvation and not after salvation! We also learn that Peter said: "The like figure whereunto baptism doth also now save us..." (1 Peter 3:21). NOTE: This indicates that baptism is not for saved people, but it is a prerequisite of salvation!

5. PEOPLE IN CHRIST! People in Christ have access unto "all spiritual blessings..." (Eph. 1:3). We learn from Romans 6:3 and Gal. 3:27 that people are "baptized into Christ." It necessarily follows that people in Christ are not subjects of baptism!

Infants, born again people, children of God, saved people, and people in Christ are NOT proper subjects of baptism!

Let us now consider the question (who are the proper subjects of baptism) from a positive view point. The following ARE proper subjects of baptism.

1. THOSE WHO ARE CAPABLE OF BEING TAUGHT THE GOSPEL! Jesus commissioned the disciples to "Go...and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost." (Matthew 28:19). In John 6:45 Jesus declared: "It is written in the prophets, And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath

BAPTISM-PROPERSUBJECTS learned of the Father cometh unto

me." NOTE: Only those who are capable of being taught, of hearing and learning of the Father can come unto Christ. The disciples were commissioned to BAPTIZE those who were taught! They were never told to baptize untaught people!

- 2. LOST PEOPLE! The fact that Jesus said: "He that believeth and is baptized SHALL BE saved..." (Mark 16:16), shows that lost people are the ones who are subjects of baptism. If baptism precedes salvation (and it does according to Jesus), we must conclude that baptism is for people who are lost!
- 3. PEOPLE WHO HAVE SINS! In Acts 2 when the Jews (who had crucified Jesus and thus were guilty of sin) asked: "What shall we do?", Peter told them to repent and be baptized FOR THE REMISSION OF SINS! (Verse 37-38). NOTE: It is obvious that these Jews had sins and desired forgiveness! Thus, these who had sins were subjects of baptism.
- 4. PEOPLE WHO ARE OUT OF CHRIST! In Rom 6:3-4 and Gal. 3:26-27 we learn that people are "baptized into Christ." Since this is true we must conclude that only those who are out of
- Christ are proper subjects of baptism!
 5. PEOPLE WHO ARE OUTSIDE OF
 THE ONE BODY, THE CHURCH! It is by
 the teaching (instruction, direction) of the
 Holy Spirit that we are "baptized into
 one body". We learn this from Paul's
 statement in 1 Cor. 12:13. We learn from
 Col. 1:18 and Eph. 1:22-23 that the body
 is the church. NOTE: Only those who
 desire to get into the "one body" are
 proper subjects of baptism.
- 6. BELIEVERS! In Mark 16:15-16 Jesus said: "...Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature. He that believeth and is baptized

shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned." In this passage Jesus indicates that belief PRECEDES baptism! In Acts 8:35-38 when the eunuch asked: "...What doth hinder me to be baptized?" Philip replied: "If thou BELIEVEST with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said: I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." We learn from the next verse that "he baptized him." Philip did not baptize the eunuch until he became a believer!

A study of Acts 8:12-13 and 18:8 will also reveal the fact that **believers** are the proper subjects of baptism!

7. PENITENT BELIEVERS! In Athens,
Greece the apostle Paul preached that
God "...now commandeth all men everywhere to REPENT." (Acts 17:30). We
learn from Acts 3:19 that repentance
precedes the blotting out of sins! Godly
sorrow works or brings about repentance! (Cf. 2 Cor. 7:10). If we do not repent, we will perish! (See Luke 13:3,5).

In Acts 2:38 Peter told some inquiring Jews to "Repent, and be baptized...for the remission of sins,..." NOTE: Repentance precedes baptism!

8. THOSE WHO CONFESS FAITH IN JESUS CHRIST! We learn from Romans 10:9-10 that "...with the mouth CONFESSION is made unto salvation." To be confessed by Jesus before the Father in heaven, we must confess Him before men! (See Matthew 10:32-33). If we deny Him, He will deny us!

From our study of the Scriptures it is clear that lost people must be taught the gospel, believe it, repent of sins and confess faith in Christ in order to be a proper subject of baptism!

Are we saved by baptism only? No! If we were saved by baptism only, one would not need to be a penitent believer and confess his faith in Christ!

THE ORIGIN OF GOD'S CREATION

In this passage Jesus Christ, no doubt, is "the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God." Does this mean that Jesus Christ is the first person (or thing) that God created? No, not at all! According to THAYER'S LEXICON, p. 77, the word translated "beginning" in this verse means "That by which anything begins to be, the origin, the active cause." So Rev. 3:14 teaches us that Jesus Christ is the origin or active cause of the creation of God! (Also see Col. 1:16)
