VAIN RELIGION

It seems that many people think and believe that there is no such thing as vain religion. It is obvious that some people think that "one religion is just as good as another religion" or " as long as you are sincere it does not matter what you believe practice religiously" or "God is pleased with all religions", etc. In contrast with the idea that "no religion is vain" the inspired writer said: "If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridled not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain." (James 1:26). Yes, it is possible for a man to be religious and his religion be vain! In fact it is possible for the religion of "brethren" to be vain!

If I do not bridle my tongue, but deceive my heart, then my religion is in vain! (See. James 1:26). In view of this I must carefully guard my speech. (Cf. 1 Peter 3:10; Psalm 34:13; Prov. 6:16-19; 15:2; 18:21; 21:23; Psalm 39:1; 35:28; 119:172; Col. 4:6; Psalm 19:14). God expects us to bridle our tongues. An unbridled tongue will cause one's religion to be vain!

We learn from Matthew 15:7-9 that the religion of the scribes and Pharisees was vain because their

heart was far from God and they taught "for doctrines the commandments of men". Although they were drawing nigh unto God with their mouths and were honouring Him with their lips their worship was in vain. They were not always teaching truth with their mouths and their hearts were far from Him. Their "tongues" played a part in their vain religion, but observe the fact that the teaching for doctrines the commandments of men made their worship in vain.

To worship God acceptably, one must worship him in spirit and in truth according to Jesus in John 4:24. He said: "they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth." The expression "in truth" means according to truth or as truth directs or according to instructions or directions found in the truth. Let us keep in mind that God's Word is truth according to John 17:17.

The Pharisees made the Word of God of "none effect" by their tradition and so can we. (Cf. Mark 7:1-13).

To practice a pure and undefiled religion a man must "visit the (Continued on page 4)

Editorial... MUST WE KEEP THE SABBATH TODAY? (No. 14)

In past articles we have shown from the Scriptures that the law that required the Israelites to keep the sabbath day holy was provisional and temporary. There is no Scriptural proof that the LORD ever intended for Christians to keep the law that He gave to the Israelites after they came out of Egypt. The sabbath day was given to a specific people for specified reasons. When that law had fulfilled its purpose it ceased to be binding. When the law that required sabbath keeping was fulfilled, it was no longer in force! (Cf. Jer. 31:31-34; Hebrews 8:6-13; 7:11-19; 9:16-17; 10:9-10; Romans 7:1-7; 2 Cor. 3:6-17; Col. 2:14-17; Gal. 3:23-27; Col. 2:14-17; etc.

In our last seven studies we have been examining some arguments made by "sabbath keepers" in an effort to show that sabbath keeping is binding on Christians today. We have shown that Scriptural proof is lacking. Assumptions and assertions are not Scriptural proof! Let us continue our study.

ARGUMENTS FOR SABBATH KEEPING CONSIDERED

25. "IN THE NEW TESTAMENT WHEN WE ARE TOLD TO KEEP OR OBEY THE LAW OF GOD (OR GOD'S COMMANDMENTS) IT ALWAYS MEANS OR INCLUDES THE SABBATH COMMAND."

REPLY:

- (1) The Sabbatarian who makes the above argument assumes and asserts his desired conclusion without proving his conclusion from the text!
- (2) The only way that one could know that the command to keep the sabbath is included would be by the text or immediate context or the general context of the Scriptures indicating that such is the case. Assuming and asserting that the sabbath command is always (or even one time) included does not prove that such is the case.
- (3) Here are some questions for Sabbatarians: "Did God ever have any commandments beside the ten commandments? If so, what were they? Does He now have any commandments beside the ten? If so, what are they? OBSERVATION: If God has some commandments (or a law), besides the ten commandments how would a Sabbatarian know that the expression "the law" "commandments" always includes the sabbath command. The truth is they don't! Another question is: "Have any of God's commandments been discontinued? If not, should we keep every commandment that God ever gave anyone? If yes, is it (Continued on page 3)

(Continued from page 2) possible that the command given to the Israelites to keep the sabbath day holy has been discontinued and does not apply to anyone today?

(4) God gave Adam a command not to eat of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil which was in the midst of the Garden of Eden. (Cf. Gen. 2:15-17; 3:1-3). NOTE: This was not one of the ten commandments. God gave Noah some commands relative to building the ark, going into the ark, etc. (Cf. Gen. 6:14-22; 7:1-5, 9, 16; Heb. 11:7.) NOTE: This was not one of the commandments. ten God gave Abraham number а commandments and he kept them according to Gen. 26:5. (Also cf. Gen. 12:1-4; 17:9-14; 22:1-19; Heb. 11:8, 17; James 2:21-23). NOTE: The command to keep the sabbath day was not included in any of these commandments.

PROOF: There is nothing in any of the texts or contexts to indicate that any of the commandments mentioned above included the command to keep the sabbath day holy. In addition to this we read the following Nehemiah 9:13-14: "Thou camest down also upon mount Sinai, and spakest with them from heaven, and gavest them right judgments, and true laws, good statutes and commandments: And madest known unto them thy holy sabbath, and commandedest them, precepts. statutes, and laws, by the hand of Moses thy servant: And gavest them bread from heaven..." NOTE: The sabbath was made known to the Israelites beginning in Exodus 16. There is no Scriptural proof that any man was ever commanded to keep the

sabbath day holy before it was given to the Israelites.

- (5) There is absolutely no *proof* that such passages as 1 Cor. 7:19; 1 John 2:3; 3:4; 3:24; 5:3; Rev. 12:17; 14:12; 22:14 refer to the ten commandments which includes the command to keep the sabbath day holy!
- (6) In writing to the church at Corinth the apostle Paul said: "If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord." (1 Cor. 14:37). NOTE: There is no evidence that Paul ever taught (either by letter or orally) that the saints at Corinth (or Christians anywhere) should keep the sabbath day holy as the Israelites (including himself) under the first covenant were taught to do.

In 1 Cor. 5 God commanded (through Paul) the saints to put away from among them the brother that was a fornicator. He told them not to keep company with "any man that is called a brother" who is fornicator, or covetous, idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner". He said: "with such an one no not to eat." In 7:10-11 the Lord gave this command: "Let not the wife depart from her husband..." In 10:31 He said: "...Do all to the glory of God." In 11:23-34 the Lord gave commands relative to the Lord's Supper. In 14:34-35 Paul said: Let your women keep silence in the churches..." In 16:2 he said: "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him..." NOTE: (Continued on page 4)

The above things in 1 Corinthians are some commandments of the Lord. There are many other commandments that the Lord gave in the New Testament that were not given in the Old Testament, OBSERVATION: The Lord commanded never anv Christian to keep the sabbath day holy! CHALLENGE: We sincerely challenge Sabbatarians to produce a passage of Scripture that shows that God commands Christians to keep the sabbath day holy! (To be continued)

fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world." (James 1:27). Two aspects of pure religion

are stated in this verse. If a man does not meet the requirements of this verse he is not practicing pure and undefiled religion. Thus his religion is vain!

As we have shown here are some things that will make our religion vain. (1) An unbridled tongue. (2) Traditions and commandments of men. (3) Impure hearts. (4) Worship that is not "in spirit and in truth". (5) Failing to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction and not keeping ourselves unspotted from the world. What about your religion? Is it in vain? You should conform your religion to the Word of God!
