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THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD'S CHURCH

The Bible teaches that each one of God's churches should be under the oversight of elders (Acts 14:23), also called presbyters (1 Tim. 4:14), pastors (Eph. 4:11), overseers (Acts 20:28), and bishops (Phil. 1:1). The qualifications for elders are given in 1 Tim. 3:1-7, and Titus 1:5-9, and may be summarized by stating that they must be men rich in the Christian graces, apt to teach, the husband of one wife with well behaved faithful children, "for if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?" (1 Tim. 3:5). The elders are not to lord it over God's heritage (1 Peter 5:3), but are to teach, guard, discipline, and rule in the spirit of love and patience. (See 1 Peter 5:1-4; Acts 20:28; Hebrews 13:17; 1 Tim. 5:17).

Each church is to be under the oversight of a plurality of elders. (Acts 14:23; Titus 1:5). The modern idea of one man being "in charge of churches" is foreign to God's word. The elders are to have oversight of one church only with no jurisdiction over any other church. Each church is free and independent under Christ to carry out its own work or to cooperate with another church if it so desires. (Of course, only cooperation as authorized in the Scriptures is allowed—Editor). One church does not interfere with any other church, and is free from interference by others.

God's word does not authorize any super

organization of churches, or the appointment of any superior church officer above the elders. When the term "chief Shepherd" is used (1 Peter 5:4) it refers to Christ, not to any elder who had been placed over the elders. Church super organizations are not only unscriptural but they always tend to assume more and more power, soon becoming dictatorial while they drain the treasuries of the local churches.

Since the days of the apostles, God has given no authority for any group of church officials to convene and legislate for the church as a whole, or for any group of churches. God has already given us His law which must not be changed or modified in any way.

God's plan provides for efficient leaders in each church with each church being completely independent. If a world catastrophe should destroy every church except one, that one would exist in its completeness, able to carry out all of its functions.

That God's plan is efficient is demonstrated by the rapid spread of the gospel during the first two centuries before men had decided to "improve" God's church organization. Also by the rapid spread of the church during the last century after the God-given plan for the church had been restored.

AN EARTHLY HEADQUARTERS?

Most religious denominations seem to take great delight in the fact that they have a centralized, earthly headquarters for their church. They choose the locations they like and the officers they want and they make laws to govern their people according to their wisdom. The "headquarters" of an organization is "the center of operations and of authority," according to WEBSTER.

Many people have the idea that "God's Word teachers that the church (i.e., the body of Christ) should have an earthly headquarters. They seem unable to understand how the body of Christ could function properly without such an earthly headquarters. Does the Word of God teach that the church of Jesus Christ should have (or even may have) an earthly headquarters? Is this idea OF FAITH? Can it be advocated BY FAITH? It can not be OF FAITH nor can it be advocated BY FAITH unless it is taught in God's Word since "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." (Romans 10:17). Let us consider the following facts:

1. There is NO DIVINE AUTHORITY for the existence of any human religious denomination. It necessarily follows that their "headquarters" could not be DIVINELY AUTHORIZED. NOTE: In this study, we will not consider the question of "an earthly headquarters" for the church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

- 2. There is NO DIVINE AUTHORITY for the church of the Lord to have "an exthly headquarters." There is no universal centralized agency authorized in the Scriptures through which God's people are to function in carrying out the work God assigned to the church as a collectivity. Organizationally, there is nothing larger or smaller or other than a local church the congregation through which God's people are to function in organized capacity to carry out the work of the church. (See Acts 20:17,28; Phil. 1:1; Acts 14:23; 1 Peter 5:1-4; Col. 3:17; 2 John 9).
- 3. JESUS CHRIST HAS ALL AUTHORITY AND RULE BOTH IN HEAVEN AND ON EARTH. After His resurrection from the dead, Jesus said: "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth." (Matthew 28:18). Paul said: "...Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all." (Ephesians 1:21-23). Also see 1 Cor. 15:23-28. WE ARE COMPLETE IN CHRIST. (See Col. 2:10).
- 4. JESUS CHRIST IS THE HEAD OF THE CHURCH. In Matthew 16:18 Jesus referred to the church as "my church." In speaking of Jesus, Paul said: "And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence." (Col. 1:18). Also see Col. 1:23; 2:19; Eph. 1:21-23; 4:15). NOTE: Surely the "headquarters" should be located where the "head" dwells.
- 5. JESUS CHRIST HAS "GONE INTO HEAVEN, AND IS ON THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD: angels and authorities and powers being made subject unto him." (1 Pet. 3:22). NOTE: Since the "head" is in heaven, if there is a "headquarters," it must be in heaven!
- 6. PAUL said: "For our CITIZENSHIP is in HEAVEN; whence also we wait for a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ." (Phil. 3:20 ASV).
- 7. Since JESUS CHRIST HAS ALL AUTHORITY AND RULE, and is the HEAD of the church, and His throne is in heaven, there can be no center of authority

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SOWING AND REAPING

"Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth that also shall he reap." (Gal. 6:7).

Have we forgotten, "we reap what we sow?"

Crime hangs over our nation, war is staring us in the face, both no doubt being the fruit of what we have sown — the nation is just reaping what is has allowed to be sown. Thieves could not prosper in their trade if they did not find sympathy among the citizenry of the nation. Bars and "package houses" would soon go out of business if none would buy their merchandise. The thief who steals and the man who helps him by concealing the stolen goods are both considered criminals and those who buy the whiskey are just as guilty of sin as those who make it and sell it.

The nation — the world — is reaping a crop of alcoholics as the ultimate fruit of "drams." To sow "dram drinkers" is to reap drunkards. The drunkard is not the man who does the most harm to others. The drunkard is apt to disgust men and turn

them from "tipping" while the gentleman, social drinker can take his "dram" and never get too much, but he is setting an example which may be followed by a drunkard's grave.

If we sow to the flesh we shall reap of the flesh. Any man who drinks even a "dram" or a can of beer knows that he is **not** sowing to the Spirit. Men drink and then add sin to contempt by lying about it. They know that it is wrong when they do.

And we all know that we are sowing either to the Spirit or to the flesh; we can not do both at the same time, and Paul plainly states that if it is to the flesh we shall reap corruption. Our nation as a whole is sowing to the flesh. To stop that sowing we must start with individuals. Individuals reap what they sow just as nations reap what they sow. We may not be able to completely control the nation, but we can control ourselves individually and that is where the good or the evil begins; that is where the sowing is done. — The above article was written by U.
